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Introduction

The Mulgrave Basketball Association had a humble beginning from basketball activities held at Smithfield State High School. After a small number of players started playing on both the undercover cement court and outdoor courts at the school in 1994, we moved into the newly built Marlin Coast Recreation Centre at Smithfield in 1995.

From these beginnings, the club, has had it's ups and downs and almost lost it's facility due to a change in management in 2018. The club is rebuilding and currently, as of 2020, has approx. 200 members including junior, senior, referees, coaches, team managers and life members. We cater for players, both male and female of all ages. It is run entirely by a team of dedicated volunteers.

We provide opportunities for players, coaches, technical officials starting with our beginner Mini Magic program, our junior domestic competition and out local adult competitions held on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

The club encourages participation in our representative program, Mulgrave Magic, with teams competing in the Queensland North Junior Basketball Challenge (QNJBC) and Queensland State Championships.

Mulgrave also has an elite program with the Mulgrave Junior Advanced Training Squad (JATS) which aims to give junior players extra opportunities to improve their skills and give them greater exposure to various competitions including tours to Melbourne and America.

This Strategic Plan has been developed to ensure that the Association continues to grow as a volunteer based organization but acknowledges that the Association also needs to be successful in a competitive environment
